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Simon Schot was one of the Inaugural Directors of ATMS who was the creator and producer of the first ATOMS Newsletter, which preceded the current ATMS Journal. Simon was bestowed Life Membership in 1989 in recognition of the personal and financial support he provided the association in its early days. Simon was well regarded amongst the profession and was generous of his knowledge and support of other practitioners and students. In appreciation of both the legacy he left behind and his vision, ATMS have proudly dedicated this Education Grant to Simon since 1998.

The Simon Schot Awards are an annual award offered by ATMS totalling \$10,000 to encourage excellence in the study of natural medicine.
